Next weekend, two centenary celebrations occur for our friends and neighbours.

Infant Jesus Sisters, better known as the Drishane Sisters, celebrate 100 years in Ireland. Founded in France in 1662, the Institute has always had a strong focus on foreign missions. Before coming to Ireland, twenty-one Irish travelled to Singapore and 52 joined in France before going on mission to Asian countries. In 1909, Drishane in Millstreet was founded to provide English speaking sisters for mission abroad. As well as Drishane, the sisters have been in Ballyferriter, Malahide, Upton, Dublin, Tralee, Drumcollogher and Mallow. In 1989, St. Joseph's Convent was opened on Model Farm Road for older sisters in need of nursing care. The sick and elderly sisters (many returned from the missions) offer prayerful support to all of us and enrich the parish abundantly. We are very grateful. Ad Multos Annos.

'May the Sacred Heart of Jesus be everywhere loved' is the motto of the **Society of the Missionaries of the Sacred Heart** which was founded by Fr. Jules Chevalier in Issoudun, France in 1854. Members of the Society arrived at Western Road, Cork in 1909 where they later founded Sacred Heart Parish. People in this area have been privileged to share many liturgical celebrations with MSCs over the years. We wish them Ad Multos Annos in this their Centenary Year
