Greetings to each of our fellow-parishioners from the Poor Clare Sisters, College Road. As we are celebrating eight hundred years since the founding of the Poor Clare Order in Assisi, Italy, (in 1212) Fr. Kieran, our Parish Priest, has asked us to contribute to the Parish Bulletin from time to time, to share a little about our life and about St. Clare.

We will begin with a glimpse into a day in the life of a Poor Clare Sister:

5.30 a.m. This is our normal rising time!

6 a.m. We commence our day with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and Meditation

7 a.m. Morning Prayer/ Divine Office i.e. Hymns, Psalms & other prayers

7.30 a.m. Holy Mass

8.05 a.m. Breakfast, followed by housework etc. (Each Sister has her duties: cooking, sacristy work, gardening, replying to letters requesting prayers etc.)

9.45 a.m. Prayer/Divine Office

10 a.m. Holy Mass

10.30 -11.30 a.m. The parlour is open to callers who wish to ask for prayers.

11.30 a.m. Spiritual Reading

12 Noon Angelus, Prayer/ Divine Office, then Dinner and wash-up!

1.30 p.m. Prayers, Divine Office

2—4 p.m. The parlour is again open to callers

Each Sister attends to her duties and also does a period of Eucharistic Adoration daily.

We are privileged to have Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament throughout the day and everyone is welcome to share in it, in our public chapel.

4.30 p.m. Meditation

5 p.m. Evening Prayer

5.30 p.m. Rosary, in our public chapel

6 p.m. Angelus, followed by Supper and Recreation

7.30 p.m. Night Prayer. We retire at about 8 p.m.

12 Midnight Prayer/Divine Office, followed by Adoration until 12.45 a.m.

We would like you to know that you all have a special place in our prayers. We feel very much part of our parish and we are praying especially for any of you who have big worries at present.

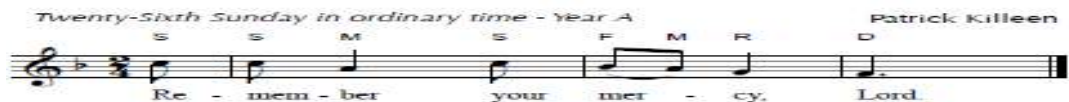
