

Greetings from the Poor Clare Monastery. We hope this month of the Holy Rosary has brought many blessings to each of you. We pray for you in our rosary every evening at 5.30pm in our Public Chapel and know that our Lady's powerful motherly love surrounds you all the time.

Living as we do on College Road, we are occasionally treated to the sounds of lively youthful students returning home in the wee hours of the morning from some nocturnal festivities! (One Sister has even heard "Silent Night" in June!). These young people remind me of St. Francis! As a teenager, he loved music, parties and "having a good time". When he discovered the love and goodness of Jesus, he began to live totally for God, devoting himself to loving God, to prayer and caring for the poor and those with leprosy.

Clare, twelve years younger than Francis, from her earliest years seems to have been a girl of exceptional goodness. As a child - in the days before Rosary Beads! - she used pebbles to count her prayers. She would discretely visit the poor of Assisi and bring food to them. When she heard of Francis' conversion (in 1209), she was fascinated and at eighteen years of age left her home, to the consternation of her wealthy family, to devote herself to Jesus, guided by Francis. Francis and Clare both learned that true happiness comes from knowing we are loved and trying to love in return! May you rejoice this day in God's love for you and may you reflect His love to everyone you meet!
