2011 CHRISTMAS APPEAL IN SUPPORT OF TURKWEL.
WATER — THE LIQUID GOLD OF LIFE

In sub-Saharan Africa 300 million people do not have a safe supply of drinking water, 80% of these live in rural areas. The Christmas Appeal this year will focus on addressing this problem for the community of Naipa, in our sister parish in Turkwel, Northern Kenya. Naipa is a small village situated south west of Lodwar town in Turkana County. It has a resident population of about 300 people (children, women and men). It is also a centre for the nomadic Turkana people who herd their animals across plains in search of grazing lands. Depending on the time of the year the population can grow to 2000 people. It is a village which is trying to develop itself – it has a small school with three classrooms, a small dispensary and a market. The people currently fetch water from the river and are very susceptible to water borne diseases. Access to clean water for this community would be a great development. With your continued generous support we hope to install a bore-hole in Naipa village which will guarantee a safe supply of water for the next 50 years. Fr. Ollie Noonan SMA, parish priest of Turkwel for the last 9 years, has identified a partner organisation that will help with the funding and drilling of a bore-hole to solve the water supply problem.







WHAT IS A BORE -HOLE? Bore-holes are drilled deep into the ground (varying in depth from 50-1,000 meters) using motorized equipment, in the location that surveying indicated was likely to contain underground water. Pipes are then installed into the hole to protect the water, a concrete pad is placed over the hole, and a hand pump is fitted to allow clean water to be brought to the surface. Depending on the depth of drilling needed to reach water, the average cost is estimated at &20,000.





It is estimated that it costs €5 to drill through 1 metre of ground in Turkwel and another €5 per metre to buy and install the steel piping needed to bring the water to the surface. So we ask you to consider how much of the drilling and piping that you would be willing to sponsor. Every metre is vital in giving this community the most precious gift - safe drinking water.

Please dig deep and support this appeal.

ANNUAL MASS FOR THE DECEASED PARISHIONERS


