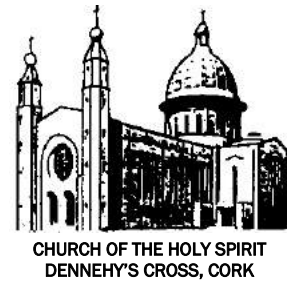

Carved Wooden Cross from Kenya

The Wooden Cross which was unveiled in the sanctuary of our church today to mark Mission Sunday was carved by a man named Peter Rutto in the Jesuit refugee Centre in Nairobi, Kenya. This cross celebrates the connection between Ballineaspaig Parish (Dennehy's Cross) and Turkwell Parish and it brings the richness of the land of Kenya and the talent of its people to our church. It was carved from the wood of a rosewood tree that fell due to age in a forest in the Kerio valley near Eldoret in northern Kenya.

Peter is an accomplished carver and woodworker. He spends a lot of his time travelling all over Kenya to make the most of the beautiful timber that has fallen due to natural or man-made causes. He had come across this piece of rosewood in 2012 and was saving it for a 'special job'.

Fr. Ollie Noonan was parish priest of our sister parish in Turkwell, Kenya for 9 years so he was asked to source a cross for the sanctuary in Ballineaspaig church. He had heard of Peter's work and visited the Refugee Centre to see some of his carvings. When he saw the quality of Peter's carvings and his amazing talent to make beautiful objects from fallen timber he knew that he had the right man for the job.

Peter was delighted and excited at the idea of carving a cross for use in our parish church here in Ballineaspaig. He knew immediately what piece of wood he would use. Fr. Ollie gave detailed information on the type and size of cross required and Peter set to work. One of the key elements in carving the cross was that it would be carved in pieces that could be easily transported from Kenya to Ireland and reassembled here. The carving took about six weeks and then it was transported to Cork.

On its arrival in Ballineaspaig the beauty of the carved figure of Christ on the simple wooden cross enraptured everybody who saw it. A mahogany stand for the cross was made by Michael Whyte, a local wood-turner and woodwork teacher. Michael copied the style of the fittings already in the church, of the lectern and the wooden candle holder that are in the sanctuary. The end result is a beautiful wooden cross that combines the talents and resources of Kenya and Ireland to adorn our sanctuary here in Ballineaspaig Parish.

We offer our thanks and pray for God's blessings on all the people involved in this commission.
