Re-opening of Churches for Personal Prayer.

Bishop Fintan has contacted us with the following message:

"We all remain very aware of and compliant with Government advice and HSE guidance in regard to Covid-19 - which may change at short notice. With this in mind, from Monday, May 18th, Churches in the Diocese of Cork and Ross will be opened for **personal prayer only**. This forms part of a phased plan towards being able to celebrate the Sacraments with a congregation at a later date."

With this in mind, our Church will be opened every day from **8.00am to 12 noon**.
