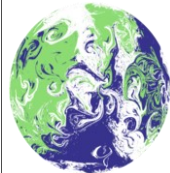
The annual Mass for parishioners who died since November 2020 will be held on **Friday 12th November, 2020 at 7.30pm.**

We are Stewards of Creation

Greta Thunberg will be there, so will President Joe Biden. The Vatican will be represented. Where?

In Glasgow for the UN Climate Change Conference, COP 26, beginning this weekend until 12 November, the 26th such international meeting.



Six years ago, at COP21 in Paris, the signatories of the Paris Agreement, including Ireland, agreed to:
limit global warming to well below 2 degrees centigrade
pursue efforts to limit the temperature increase even further to 1.5 degrees.

But current action and pledges leave the world well off track to meeting these goals and to avoiding the most dangerous heat waves, floods, damage to natural systems, rising sea levels and spread of diseases that higher temperatures will bring.

To our shame, Ireland is not on track to meet the commitments we signed up to. In fact, we are third worst of the signing countries! Ireland needs urgently to introduce policies and action "above and beyond" its current commitments (Laura Burke, EPA Director).

The issue of climate finance will be fundamental to the success of COP 26. In 2009 the richer countries, which are responsible for most carbon emissions, pledged to raise \$100 billion a year by 2020, to help poorer countries cope with climate change. Poorer countries' emissions are generally very low. This target has been missed!

2021 is regarded as the "make or break" year to get us on track to confront the global climate crisis. At this stage, we all need to support our politicians to do what is necessary, and to pray for their vision and courage to do what is right, just, and vital for the future of Our Common Home.
