

### A NEW YEAR GIFT

Again and again our religion reminds us of our sinfulness and our unworthiness to be in God's presence let alone to be His children. So often the emphasis seems to be on our moral failures and on the need to improve.

It is not surprising then, that some people seeing no improvement in themselves or in others, lose hope of ever making the grade and losing heart, they go the

journey of life alone and opt out of the partnership with God which the pilgrimage of life is meant to be and can be.

Sunday's readings take a very different approach. They open up a new vision of God pitching His tent among us, choosing us to be children sharing in the glory of the Father as children should do.
