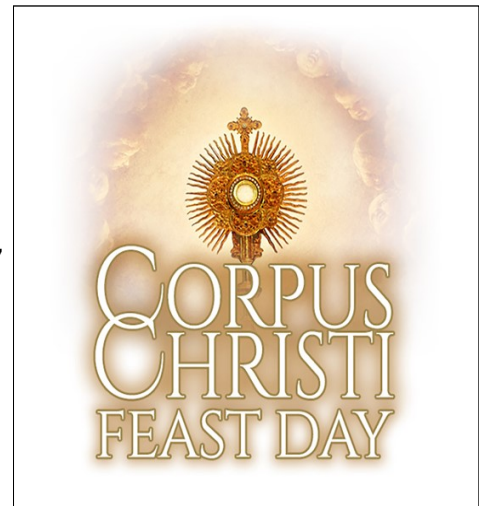

Luke 9: 11-17

"GIVE THEM SOMETHING TO EAT YOURSELVES."

There is no mixed messaging in the Master's definite guideline to the disciples as we read this weekend's Gospel. In their enthusiastic day long following of Jesus, some of the crowd brought no food. They were now weak with hunger through their own carelessness. The disciples solution to the difficulty was to send them packing to provide for themselves. Jesus had a different approach. Share whatever resources you have fairly among all who are hungry even with those who do not seem to deserve it.

Like the disciples, we often feel entitled to selfishly reserve for ourselves and even hoard whatever we have earned or inherited, even though everything is God's gift for all the family through us, His children. Jesus leads the way not only by word but by example as He gives us Himself in the Eucharist. We give thanks for this gift, especially on today's Feast of Corpus Christi, the Feast of His Body and Blood. Every time we celebrate the Eucharist, we are reminded that His sharing in our human nature makes us His privileged sisters and brothers sharing in His divine love and that He is really present in each of us always. We worship Him in our respect filled generous loving care of each other.



Through the Eucharist, He empowers us "to give them something to eat ourselves", to give them a home to live in, a country to be safe in, a medical service to care for them, a sense of true belonging

Prayer and worship must change us, enrich us, bring us inner peace, mould us into the image of Jesus, our brother.
