Hidden World

The first of the Lenten Talks recently highlighted the hidden world of people trafficking in Ireland. We know very little about the details, but we do know that each year worldwide, over 2.5 million men, women and children are victims of trafficking and slavery. For those engaged in trafficking, it has become one of the most lucrative illegal activities in the world. In the Catholic Church we dedicate February 8th every year as a Day of Prayer and Remembrance for such victims,



Feast Day of St. Josephine Bakhita, herself a former slave. This coming week highlights our most famous Irish victim.

St. Patrick was trafficked to Ireland. Writing his life story he says that we was taken by force to Ireland from his father's house in a part of Europe that was in the Roman Empire" and this is where I am now, in all my insignificance, among strangers ...". We can only imagine his loneliness and fear, a loneliness and fear shared by so many others right now, perhaps in this country. So, even as we celebrate St. Patrick's Day this coming week, we might spare a thought for unwilling and powerless people imprisoned by a new and fearful version of slavery Visitors here, not by choice or happy celebrating, but of a hidden and powerful evil. May St. Patrick free them to a better world and a better Ireland.
