Early Days

Just like many people predicted, September is proving to be an Indian Summer. The sun is really warm and the evenings get very heavy. It is early days at school or new job. A family I know has moved to Hong Kong because of work for two years; one of the three children stays behind in Cork for college, the other two head for new school adventures in a totally different culture. Another family are in Bosnia because the father is in the Irish Defence forces at work there. All need time to adjust. Twelve of my colleagues are doing what I did a year ago: settle into a new parish or assignment and find their way. It can be both daunting and exciting. In these early days they may feel lost and make mistakes; equally they might be able to break new ground and make an impression. It all lies before them.

I wonder was it similar the early days of those disciples with Jesus. Did they feel out of their depth, lost, away from their familiar lives in that Sea of Galilee. Being told they would now be fishers of men was hardly going to help. But there was certainly excitement and a new sense of belonging and a man they were following who was not like other men or prophets but 'who taught them with authority behind it'. And in their excitement they often made mistakes, said the wrong thing, got carried away, just like Simon Peter did. In time they would have to face suffering in every possible way, most of all in this man they followed and loved. How was he going to prepare them for that way?

Matthew was the odd one out, the tax collector who did not belong. He is writing at a time when Jesus is not physically present but 'wherever two or three are gathered in my name'.

Jesus gives advice. The advice is about conflict, division among the brothers, within the community....and taking responsibility. Everything is to be done out of love, but you must face the conflict, 'have it out with him' and very importantly 'win him back', win back your brother. That is a powerful moment, because 'he listened to you'.

There is always the possibility you will be listened to when you approach someone who needs your advice, even if they do not know it, and win them back. Where silence might permit greater division in the community, love must do something, those early days.
