Everybody is looking for You

The house of Peter's mother in law is today located in northern Israel, by the Galilee lake. A modern church, shaped like an upturned boat, stands over it. As recently as last June I celebrated Mass there, just a few short weeks before the terror that led to the Gaza crisis. It was here that the events of this weekend's gospel take place. Her fever was lifted by Jesus and she began to wait on them. The result is an avalanche of sick and possessed people are brought to this healing Rabbi whose identity is obscure yet one who not only heals but 'has authority behind him'. He seems to be the real thing. Again we notice an important feature, he would not allow the possessed demons to speak because 'they knew who he was'. So he is a puzzle to the crowds. He is a puzzle they want to solve.

But, he disappears, long before dawn, and so everybody is looking for him.

It has often happened that famous people, many of them talented, have disappeared in the past: great writers, performers, geniuses, and some remained obscure forever. This may have been by their own choice, others because fame was too much to handle. Fame is fleeting and has a double edge, and people in the public eye are a target for all sorts of comment, both good and bad.

Jesus did disappear, into the tomb of death, and reappears. But all of that is in the future. The crowds that follow him seem genuine in their search for him. Jesus keeps moving and they follow, a good bit of way.

Here the story is put on hold. Two thousand years later the search continues. Who and what are we looking for? Is God looking for us? Will he find us? Will we find ourselves? Christ is still being crucified, to paraphrase Jim Larkin, in our streets, by thoughts, words and actions. Yet he also reigns, and is uplifted, by those very same things. Shortly we will have a chance again to explore the search for Jesus, and with it, the search for our very selves, in the Lenten journey.
