### **Some Thoughts**

With St. Patrick's Day coming up, I thought I would share some thoughts with you about our parish. The Lenten Talks have just concluded, and although I only managed to be present for two of them, I must say the Faith in Action group can take great pride in their work. Firstly, to have talks at all during Lent is very important. It helps us to reflect, explore, inform and renew ourselves. It also broadens the horizons of faith and how we might play our part, finding new ways of understanding what we believe in and nourish our spirits on life's journey. To find new speakers and inspirations every year is indeed a blessed thing and we will all benefit as we reach the halfway mark of Lent 2024.

One other feature has been the Climate Candle which has accompanied all the parish meetings in the past three weeks. In it we pledge ourselves to act in a responsible and godly way to the world's resources, in our own personal behaviour. It has given me the idea of having a Vocations Candle. Recently the Bishop called a number of us parishes together to begin the process of a Circle of Prayer for Vocations to the Priesthood. Because the Creation Candle travelled to our schools also, it is possible this may also be a way of promoting awareness of a priestly vocation at a critical time. It would combine prayer with a wider community. We shall see. It would be important not to confuse the two things.

As members of a wider group of the Family of Parishes, we will shortly share the Reconciliation Service for Easter, by all travelling for the Sacrament in Curraheen Road Church on Palm Sunday at 5.00pm. We will offer Mass in each other's churches once a month and hope to have a common preparation for Baptism, something sorely needed here.

The words of the Book of Genesis keep coming back to me this St Patrick's weekend.

"Go from your country and your people and your father's house to the land I will show you. I will make of you a great nation. I will bless you and make your name so famous, that it will be used as a blessing".
