THE EMMAUS LEGACY

Genuine promises can inspire greatness and lead to lasting happiness; promises to a life partner, to a child, to a friend, to a family, to Jesus; a promise of loyalty, of service, of care, of love, of continual forgiveness, of shelter, of food.

Unfulfilled and broken promises undermine trust in the hearts of the disappointed and often lead to deep anxiety and fear. This can happen to us individually or among us as a group. This certainly happened to the disciples holed up in a locked upper room after the death of Jesus. He had promised so much and seemed to have delivered so little. They were devastated. So much so that two of them decided to abandon ship and headed for Emmaus. They were so blinded by the hurt and the fear that they did not recognise Jesus as He joined them on the road.

Something similar can happen to us in these swiftly changing times that are filled with misinformation, false expectations and crippling fears. To protect ourselves, we create self-centred boundaries that prevent us seeing the promised potential of the Jesus option to live as brothers and sisters in His continuous presence.

In fact, it was only when they offered shelter to the stranger and shared food with Him that Jesus revealed Himself to them and they returned to the community of believers.

Is there a message for each of us today, no matter where we are on the spectrum of loyalty to Jesus and His Church?
