Open ended

I have a friend who has a very interesting way of conversing with me; she starts off as if we were chatting only a few minutes previously. Whether it is on the phone or on the bus there's no awkward start like ...how are you?...we just dive into chatting without taking a breath. It might not make much sense sometimes to anyone listening to us. There's no beginning, middle or end; just a constant flow. When we finish the whole thing is still up in the air and when we meet or chat again, it's a whole new flow. I follow the thread of it a little and we keep it going. It's a whole mixture of memories, observations and opinions and is very entertaining.

The Ascension is like that conversation. At one level it completes the mission of Jesus; the time has come for him to return to the Father. But it is also open ended, marking the beginning of 'new time' when the apostles must now stand on their own, without the physical presence. One minute they are looking up into the sky, the next they are going out to the whole world, proclaiming the good news. And then, where are we?

Perhaps we ourselves are also like that open ended conversation. The Kingdom of God is without beginning or end and there we are, in the middle of it. Sometimes it might make no sense to us and we might feel lost, but like the conversation we keep going. The gospel story still opens up a world of endless possibilities and our own part in that story is not yet complete. We live in hope, we wait for the next conversation and all it might bring.
