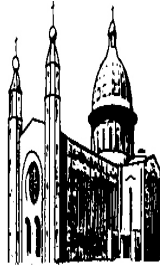

The little you have

It often happens that you feel you don't put enough into your day. It may be that you are retired or in a position like me with no regular nine to five routine. You may have to 'invent' your work. It might be volunteering, catching up on paperwork, doing some visiting. Any of the days of the week that are not full of activity you might think yourself unfulfilled, slightly empty, or dissatisfied in some way. The passing of time is a strange thing; we often wonder where the time goes but an individual day can be very slow.

I am struck by the story of the woman with little to give in this weekend's gospel. Jesus sits in the temple in Jerusalem and observes people putting money in the Treasury, an everyday occurrence. This one day the widow with little to give arrives and leaves 'all she had'. The whole event is over in seconds, nobody else either noticed it or commented, no words are spoken. Yet it speaks volumes

To some extent, not always, we all have 'little to give'; whether in money, effort, energy, activity or conversation. Around us may be filled with hustle and bustle while we might trudge along, just like this Christmas season which is approaching. Remember Jesus in the company of Martha and Mary, '*Martha, Martha, you worry and fret about so many things, and yet few are needed*'. The few indeed might be enough: enough in any day to write a single letter, a short entry to your Journal, a quiet prayer, a blessed or happy thought, even a single phrase that can stay with you. It might be a little event you observed like Jesus did that brought it all into perspective. Until next week.
