Letter from America

I am writing this on the morning of the Feast of the Transfiguration. Last evening we had Confessions for over an hour after the Mass in Spanish; I am only here five days and already heard Confessions for over five hours. I had my first visit to the hospital yesterday, an elderly lady who was dying surrounded by mostly Hispanic family. Apart from all that it has been relatively quiet. On Friday evening I spent time with a lady who lost her home in the fires of last January; many a time I used to visit that home, on a Sunday evening after Mass. She is in a nice one bedroom apartment paid for by her insurance for twelve months; but she will have to make tough decisions about whether to rebuild on her now empty site, the only way to retain some of the original value. Otherwise speculators will try buying up the lot cheaply. Many others are in the same situation, living nearby.

I am in a Rectory with three other priests: a new priest from Mexico, a priest from India and the parish priest originally from Cuba. According as they go on holidays, others come to fill in. A priest from Spain came late last night and I came last Thursday. We are well looked after, there is a cook here for all meals as well as housekeeping. I will be using a car of anyone who has gone away. On my journey here I was very happy with Assistance at the three airports; because of my recent illness I had to use it. Cork airport staff were very kind; I got a front seat in the plane and in Los Angeles I was through customs and immigration in fifteen minutes. The temperature here is a steady 30 degrees each day and I generally offer the 8.15 Mass in the morning. Today, being Transfiguration Day, there are altar servers and singing.

We are in a part of the city of Pasadena known as OldTown; a lively enough place and tourist attraction. The famous Rose Bowl stadium is nearby as well as JPL, the Centre for exploration of Mars. At one end of the parking lot here is a major Funeral Director, Cabot and Sons. We are right beside the 210 freeway which is always busy and is known as the moving car park. It is the main artery through Southern California.

This weekend I prayed at Mass here in Pasadena for Denis Buckley and Tom Gleeson, our parishioners from Model Farm Road and Farranlea Grove who passed away this week and I send greetings to Father Prasad, Bishop Noel as well as Father Tom and Father Dan; together with the home team in our parish. Until next week.
