A formidable one-woman pressure group is the centre-piece of this weekend's Gospel. Officialdom had not dealt fairly with her in her widowhood. As those in power ignored her plight, she decided on a sit-down protest at the Judge's front gate until her case was heard. Her approach was non conformist, but it brought results.

Jesus suggests that we do something similar with God, similar but different. The aggrieved widow was challenging the Judge to change his ways. Jesus is challenging us to change our ways by establishing a daily prayer routine to show God that we appreciate His constant love of us and His endless care of us. He tests our perseverance in varied ways that actually can nourish our joyful response to His love.

Jesus excels in telling a parable, a story that carries a message for each one of us to mine individually. Only the persevering miner finds a treasure.
