Endurance

The mother of missing school boy Philip Cairns died earlier this week. Of all the known missing people of our country, this very sad case has been in my mind a lot and perhaps in yours as well. Possibly because I was a teacher in school in Cork city at the time made it all the more real for me because it could have happened anywhere

Philip was 13 when he went missing on 23 October 1986 while making his way back to Colaiste Eanna in Rathfarnham in Dublin where he was a First Year student. He was after his lunch; it was in broad daylight. He has never been seen since.

His mother, Alice Cairns, died on Tuesday.

Her husband, Philip senior predeceased her and she is survived by their remaining five children.

Six days after he disappeared, Philip's school bag was found dumped in a laneway a short distance from his home.

Some of his books were missing from his bag; they happened to include his Religion books.

In 2016, Mrs Cairns spoke to RTE's Today programme with Sean O Rourke where she said she felt 'robbed of her son' and that he was robbed of a future.

She said she has to have her own peace and for that 'you have to forgive'.

His brother Eoin said

"Philip is always there in the sense he is not there. At Christmas, birthdays, weddings and other family occasions we think of how Philip would be there with us".

'Your endurance will win you your lives', are the last lines of St Luke this weekend.

What this family endured and how they faced it can never be fully explained or appreciated .

All we can hope for is that their fortitude the inner strength that perseveres when the normal sources of courage are exhausted, will win for Alice Cairns and her family that peace they never got in this world.
