You are God's building

This weekend we celebrate the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome. It is regarded as the Mother Church because it is the oldest Christian church in Rome, built on the Lateran Hill on a tract of land given by the first Christian Emperor, Constantine. It is not the oldest in the world, the earliest were built in what is now Armenia; many of them still existing, built into mountains. But the Lateran Basilica has a special place in the heart of the Catholic Church and its dedication is so important as to supplant the particular Sunday. The earliest Christians lived in communities, but no building that might be regarded as a church; mostly they gathered in people's homes. St Paul, in his Letter to the people of Corinth, tells them they are God's building or temple and cautions them against fighting and arguing with each other, but rather that they must not destroy that temple because the spirit of God 'is living in you'. When you read that the Temple as described in the Gospel this weekend, the one where Jesus drives away the sellers of the offerings, is later destroyed, you realise how prophetic the words spoken both about the Temple itself and 'the sanctuary that is my body'.

God's building here in Dennehy's Cross is very much from the people. It may have been part of the Rosary of Churches as conceived by Bishop Lucey, who also gave the idea of its unusual design. But it was the people that made it possible. The new houses were full of young families who gave of their efforts to raise the money week after week, year after year. It must have a meant great sacrifice and effort; the late fifties and early sixties were not known for big earnings and money was scarce. The whole process of asking people would have difficult but it was achieved and many of the people who made this possible are still with us. So, in a very real sense, the dedication of the Mother Church in Rome will also remind us of the Mother Church here among us and that spirit of God is living in us.
